

# **Competition rules**

#### I. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. The 2<sup>nd</sup> ROMANO GANDOLFI International Choral Conducting Competition (the *Competition*) is organized with the aim of spreading choral culture, helping the talented conductors of the next generation to start an international career, bridging the gap between training and professional activity.
- 2. The Competition is organised by *AERCO*, *Associazione Emiliano-Romagnola Cori*, in collaboration with the *Associazione Favorita del Re-Centro Studi Romano Gandolfi*, the *Municipality of Medesano*, the *University of Parma*, and with the patronage of *FENIARCO*, *ANDCI*, the *Emilia-Romagna Region* and the *Municipality of Parma*.
- 3. The Competition will take place from 26 to 28 November 2021 at the Sala Civica 'R. Gandolfi' in Medesano, the Aula Magna of the University of Parma and the Auditorium del Carmine in Parma.
- 4. The official language of the competition is English.

#### II. PARTICIPANTS

The competition is open to choral conductors, students or graduates in Italy and abroad, born between 1 January 1981 and 25 November 2003.

# III. REGISTRATION

- 1. To register, you need to fill in an online form, available at https://bit.ly/2EMoqbl.
- 2. The competition entry form must be accompanied by:
  - A. A current passport photo in digital format.
  - B. A scan of an identity document showing the date of birth of the competitor.
  - C. Curriculum Vitae of the candidate indicating the artistic activity undertaken and the studies achieved.
- 3. If still a student, a letter of introduction of the candidate from the Director of the musical institution attended is welcome.
- 4. Transmission of the completed competition entry form is considered acceptance of these competition rules.
- 5. The deadline for submitting entry forms for the competition is 30 August 2021.

# IV. ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Candidates will be selected by a committee composed of members of AERCO's Artistic Commission, on the basis of the applications received, including all the documents required by the Competition Rules. The curriculum vitae submitted shall be the relevant element for selection.
- 2. A maximum of 16 candidates will be admitted to the first phase of the competition.
- 3. The committee may establish a list of candidates 'on the waiting list'.
- 4. The list of candidates admitted to the first phase of the Competition will be published on the websites <a href="www.choralconductorcompetition.eu">www.choralconductorcompetition.eu</a> and <a href="www.aerco.it">www.aerco.it</a> by 15 September 2021. Admitted candidates will receive, by 20 September 2021, a written notification from the Organisation.

















#### V. COSTS

1. Candidates admitted to the Competition will be required to pay an entry fee of €50 (non-refundable) by 30 September 2021.

- 2. Failure to pay the registration fee by 30 September 2021 will be considered as the candidate's decision not to participate in the Competition.
- 3. The Organisation will provide, at its own expense, accommodation and breakfast (4 days from the evening of 25 November to the morning of 29 November) for competitors taking part in the Competition.
- 4. The organisation will not reimburse participants' travel expenses.
- 5. Any accompanying persons will pay their own accommodation costs in Parma.

#### VI. PHASES OF THE COMPETITION

1. The competition will consist of three phases, during which the participants will be evaluated on the basis of their work.

# PHASE I. - 26 November 2021 - ELIMINATORY - 16 competitors

- A. concertation, for a maximum duration of 7 minutes, of a piece chosen by lot on the evening of Thursday 25 November from among seven available. The final performance of the piece itself is not compulsory. *Workshop Choir: Male Choir 'Storie dai Monti' of Parma*.
- B. performance, without the possibility of concertation, of one of eight pieces chosen by lot at the time. *Workshop Choir: 'I Madrigalisti di AERCO'*.

The order in which the conductors will perform will be drawn on the evening of Thursday 25 November.

The 8 participants with the highest score in Phase I will be admitted to Phase II.

### PHASE II. - 27 November 2021 - SEMIFINALS - 8 competitors

- A. concertation and performance of a piece chosen by lot from six available pieces on the evening of Friday 26 November. The candidate will have a maximum time limit of 15 minutes. *Workshop Choir: Paer Choir of Colorno*.
- B. concertation and performance of a piece chosen by lot, on the evening of Friday 26 November, among nine available. The candidate will have a maximum time limit of 10 minutes. *Workshop Choir: 'Aurora' Children's Choir of Mirandola*.

The order in which the conductors will perform will be drawn on the evening of Friday 26 November.

















The 5 participants with the highest score in Phase II will be admitted to Phase III.

# PHASE III. - 28 November 2021 - FINALS - 5 competitors (tests A and B); 3 competitors (test C)

- A. concertation and performance of two pieces of Gregorian chant chosen by lot from eight proposed pieces. The candidate will have a maximum time limit of 15 minutes. *Workshop Choir: 'I Cantori Gregoriani'*.
- B. concertation and performance of a piece chosen by lot at the time and not repeatable, from among 5 proposed pieces. The candidate will have a maximum time limit of 20 minutes. *Workshop Choir: 'Corul Madrigal' (Romania)*.
- C. performance in public concert of a piece drawn by lot at the moment and not repeatable, among 3 proposed. *Workshop Choir: 'Corul Madrigal' (Romania)*.

The order of performance of the conductors for rehearsals A and B will be drawn on the evening of Saturday 27 November. The order of performance of the conductors for rehearsal C will be drawn on Sunday 28 November, immediately after the end of phase B.

#### VII. AWARDS

1. The international jury of the competition may award the following prizes:

#### **1ST PRIZE**

- A grant of € 3,500
- A seat as a jury member at the third edition of the Romano Gandolfi International Choral Conducting Competition, November 2023.
- <u>Marin Constantin</u> Prize offered by the *Corul Madrigal* consisting of a trophy and an invitation to conduct a concert by the choir itself.
- Diploma.

#### 2ND PRIZE

- A grant of 1,500 euros
- Diploma.

# **3RD PRIZE**

- A grant of 1,000 euros
- Diploma.

#### **SPECIAL AWARDS**

- Scholarship of € 500 for the conductor with the most similar artistic characteristics to M° Romano Gandolfi (prize awarded by a special jury)
- Scholarship of 500 euros for the best approach to Gregorian Chant, awarded by the *Cantori Gregoriani*.
- 2. The scholarships awarded will be subject to taxation in accordance with the regulations in force in Italy.
- 3. Depending on the rules of the competition, other special prizes may also be awarded.
- 4. All participants in the competition will receive a certificate of participation.
- 5. The jury's decisions are final.

After submission of the completed competition entry form, the candidate:

  - a. with regard to reproduction recording by means of digital sound and image technology, production of CDs and/or DVDs or other media;
  - b. as regards the distribution of copies on which an artistic performance has been recorded the placing on the market, lending or hiring out;
  - c. with regard to the dissemination of the performances in a manner other than that specified in point b above: broadcasting, rebroadcasting and making available to the public on selected web pages.
- 3. They agree to the processing of their personal data for purposes related to the Competition, in accordance with the declaration made on the registration form. Personal data are provided by candidates on a voluntary basis, but their submission is required for participation in the Competition.
